## CORNWALL CELTICS SCORE BUZZER BEATING GOAL WIN AT PEE WEE FINALS

In the Pee Wee “B” finals the Newmarket Redbirds 1 took on the Oshawa Blue Knights 1 in the championship game. Both teams entered the game undefeated looking to cap off a perfect tournament. In the first period the Blue Knights took a 2-1 with goals coming from Cameron Mullin and Liam O’Dette. Tucker Kauffeldt would score for the Redbirds. Newmarket would score first in the second period to tie the game 2-2 thanks to Brenden McLeod. But Oshawa would score three straight goals from Zach Naherne (2 goals), and William Gaksall to put the Blue Knights up 5-2. In the third period Newmarket attempted to mount a comeback by scoring two goals from Pano Fimis and Thomas Sirman. But the Redbirds would ultimately come up short as Oshawa would hold on for the 5-4 victory and the Pee Wee “B” championship.

In the Pee Wee “C” championship there was another close game that came down to the final second between the Cornwall Celtics and the Sudbury Rockhounds. The Celtics returned to the finals for the second straight year and were looking to redeem themselves after losing in 2015. In the first period Sudbury would take an early lead with a goal from Ben Harris. But towards the end of the period Landon Brownlee’s goal for Cornwall would tie the game at 1-1. In the second period Sudbury would take a 3-1 lead thanks to goals from Ashton Eadie and Brek Morrow. In the third period the teams began by exchanging goals to but the score at 4-2. Then Cornwall would mount a comeback scoring 2 goals in 30 seconds from Landon Brownlee and Braden Bowen to tie the game at 4-4. Then in the dying seconds of the game Ethan Montroy would score with one second left on the clock to win the game for Cornwall 5-4 and bring home the Pee Wee “C” championship.

The Pee Wee “D” finals saw another close championship game between the Stayner Hitmen and the Midland Braves. The game started with a 1-1 tie in the first period with Easton Penna scoring for the Braves and Robbie Butwell scoring for the Hitmen. hold on to the lead and become Pee Wee “D” champions.

The Pee Wee “E” finals needed overtime to decide the winner between the Welland Raiders and the Hamilton Bengals 2. In the first period the Bengals jumped out to a 3-0 lead with goals coming from Jonah Onland, Justin Brennecke, and Isaac Peeres. In the second period the Raiders would return the favour by scoring three goals of their own from Nathan Lambrechts, Perrin Alvey, and Ryan Andrews to tie the game at 3-3.
