MIDGET CHAMPIONSHIPS FEATURE THREE NAILBITERS

The Brampton Excelsiors took on the Clarington Gaels for the Midget B title. The game seemed one-sided early, with Clarington taking a 3-0 lead into the first intermission, with two goals from JP Swift. Brampton wouldn't back down though, with Fraser Mackenzie scoring twice in the second period, cutting the score to 3-2 heading into the final frame. Brampton would tie the game early in the third, and Kyle Avery would score mid-way through the frame to give Brampton a 4-3 lead. Brampton would close this one out, completing the comeback and winning the Midget B banner.

The Midget C championship featured the West Durham Rockmen and the Northumberland Nemesis. Tyler Woodland would score the lone goal of the first period, putting Northumberland up early. Northumberland would take a 3-0 lead into the third period, just fifteen minutes away from securing the Midget C banner. Cameron Shea would score twice for West Durham early in the period, but Northumberland would shut them down the rest of the way, holding onto a 3-2 victory. Matthew Dees second period goal would end up being the game-winner.

The Midland Braves faced off with the London 2 Blue Devils for the Midget D championship. The game was a battle of the defenses before an offensive explosion in the third period. London took a 2-1 lead into the second period, before a total of seven goals were scored in the final frame. Zack Gignac would complete his hat trick early in the third period to give Midland a 3-2 lead. London would fire back with two goals of their own, mid-way through the frame, to regain a 4-3 lead heading into the final minutes of the game. Midland captain Noah Quarrington would then step up to the plate, scoring a hat trick within the final four minutes of the game and leading Midland to a 6-4 championship win.
