DOUBLE-OVERTIME THRILLER HIGHLIGHTS PEE WEE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Cornwall Celtics won a nail biter of a final against the Gloucester Griffins for the Pee Wee B Provincial Championship at the 2017 Ontario Lacrosse Festival. Joe Vida would open the scoring for Cornwall in the first period as the team took a 1-0 lead into the intermission. Cornwall would extend their lead to 3-0 by the second intermission, before things got interesting in the third frame. Gloucester would score three times in the final frame but ultimately; Ethan Montroy's third period tally would be too much for Gloucester to come back from. Montroy and Vida both scored twice in Cornwall's 4-3 championship win.

The Pee Wee C final saw the Six Nations Warriors faceoff with the Hamilton Bengals. The score remained close for the first two periods of the game, with Six Nations taking a 2-1 lead into the second intermission. The Six Nations offence then exploded for five goals in the third frame, led by Noah McQueen's four-goal performance. Six Nations took home the Pee Wee C banner with a convincing 7-1 victory.

The Pee Wee D final was a double overtime thriller as the Kawartha Lakes Fury took on the Oshawa 2 Blue Knights. Max Falzon scored twice in the first period for Oshawa but Kawartha Lakes countered with two goals of their own to keep the game deadlocked at the first break. Oshawa would go on to take a 5-4 lead into the third period. Hayden Vokins scored twice in the third period, to complete his hat trick, and even the game for Kawartha Lakes at 6-6 at the conclusion of three periods. The First period of overtime would settle nothing, as the score remained 6-6 heading into double-overtime. Double-overtime didn't last long, as 33 seconds into the frame, Tanner Harris would end the game with a clutch goal that made Kawartha Lakes the Pee Wee D champions.

The Halton Hills 2 Bulldogs took on the Peterborough 2 Lakers in the Pee Wee E final. Halton Hills came out flying, scoring three early goals and taking a 3-0 lead into the first intermission. Peterborough would battle back in the second period, scoring two goals and shutting down the Halton Hills offence to make the score 3-2 heading into the final frame. Mid-way through the third period, Lucas Denning

would score the eventual game-winner, as Halton Hills went on to capture the Pee Wee E championship with a 6-3 victory.
