TYKE SEES LOPSIDED CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tyke A Championship featured the Bulldogs from Halton Hills and the Lakers from Peterborough. Halton Hills would jump out to an early 2-0 lead and wouldn't look back the rest of the game. Halton Hills would outscore Peterborough in all three periods of play on-route to a convincing 9-4 victory. Colton D'Amico would star for Halton Hills, scoring a hat trick in the Championship win.

The Innisfil Wolfpack took on the Nepean Knights in the Tyke B final. Innisfil came out of the gates hot, taking a 2-0 lead into the first intermission. Nepean would then turn it up a notch, scoring 4 second period goals and taking a 4-3 lead into the final frame. A lopsided third period secured an 8-4 victory for the Nepean Knights. Evan Kay and Cameron McKeown both scored a pair in the Tyke B win.

The Tyke C Championship was a face-off between the Akwesasne Storm and the Owen Sound North Stars. Owen Sound exploded for five goals in the first period, taking control of the contest. By the time Rarontiiostha Pembleton put Akwesasne on the board, Owen Sound had taken a commanding 7-1 lead. Josh Rayner and Miles Tennant both scored twice in Owen Sounds eventual 9-3 victory.

The Stayner Hitmen battled with the Oakville 2 Hawks in the intense Tyke D final. Gavin Kerr opened the scoring for Oakville just seconds into the game, but Stayner would take a 3-2 lead into the first intermission. Kerr again scored just seconds into the second period to tie the game 3-3, but Carson Kemsley scored his second of the game minutes later to re-establish the Stayner lead. Isaak Giguere's second period goal would prove to be the game-winner, as Stayner went on to win the final 5-4.

The Tyke E Final was another close contest, featuring the Midland Braves and the Sarnia 2 Pacers. Kathleen Dion buried the games opening goal, giving Midland an early lead. Midland would ride this hot start to a 3-1 lead at the conclusion of the opening frame. Tucker Ysebaert would shut-down the Midland offence the rest of the game, giving his team a chance to fight their way back into the contest. Owen Passmore would score his second goal of the game, with just over three minutes left,

to give Sarnia the 4-3 lead. This goal would hold up the rest of the way, as Sarnia became the Tyke E champions.
