Peterborough takes home the Novice A Championship

The Peterborough Lakers did battle with the London Blue Devils for the Novice A Championship. Peterborough opened the scoring and added a second in the first period to take a 2-0 lead into the intermission. London would answer with a goal in the second period to cut the score to 2-1 heading into the final frame. Braden Hockaday would shut it down the rest of the way as The Lakers held on to win the Novice A Finals by a score of 2-1.

The Novice B Championship saw the Burlington 2 Chiefs face off with the Sarnia Pacers. Burlington scored twice in the first period and held off the Sarnia offense for a 2-0 lead at the break. The Chiefs scorers exploded in the second period, scoring five unanswered goals to take a commanding 7-0 lead into the final frame. The teams would trade two goals apiece as Burlington held on for a 9-2 Championship victory. Colton Dinelle led the way with a hat trick for The Chiefs.

The Toronto Beaches 2 took on the Cornwall Celtics for the Novice C Championship. Cornwall scored within the first two minutes of the game to take the lead but Toronto would counter within the last two minutes of the first period to tie the game 1-1 after fifteen minutes. The Celtics pulled away in the second period with five unanswered goals for a 6-1 lead. The teams would again trade goals in the third as Cornwall held on for a 7-2 finals victory. Campbell McMaster and Kane Robertson scored a pair each in the win.

The Novice D final was a battle between the Kahnawake Mohawks and the Oshawa Blue Knights. Oshawa scored the lone goal in the first period and added two more in the second to take a three-goal lead before The Mohawks scored late in the second period. The Blue Knights would score again early in the third to regain their three goal lead but Kahnawake turned it on midway through the third period, with a hat trick from Rawehrenhatie Jacobs to bring the game back to 4-3. The Mohawks would run out of time in their comeback attempt as Oshawa sealed the Novice D Championship to win 4-3.

The Novice E final was a back and forth matchup between the Pelham 2 Raiders and the Oakville 3 Hawks. The Hawks outscored Pelham by a score of 3-1 in the first period to take a comfortable lead into the break. The Raiders answered by outscoring Oakville 3-1 in the second period for a 4-4 deadlock going into the final

frame. Jonathan Outschoorn would score midway through the third, his fourth of the game, to give Oakville the lead. Oakville would add another late to win the final 6-4.

The Midland Braves faced off with the Guelph 3 Regals for the Novice F Championship. After a scoreless first period, Guelph opened up the scoring just 18 seconds into the second period. Midland answered with two goals of their own to take a 2-1 lead into the final frame. Guelph would score three goals in a three minutes span, midway through the third to pull ahead 4-2. The Braves would score one late, but it wouldn't be enough as The Regals held on for the Novice F Championship.
