Blue Devils finish at the top of the Tyke Divison

The London Blue Devils did battle with the Peterborough Lakers for the Tyke A Championship. Peterborough scored the first two goals of the game before The Blue Devils added a late first period goal to trail 2-1 heading into the intermission. The Lakers would outscore London 2-1 again in the second to lead 4-2 with just 15 minutes to play. London came out firing in the final period, scoring an impressive six goals to Peterborough's one to comeback and win the Championship 8-5. Logan Tallevi was the star of the game, scoring four teams to lead London to victory.

The Tyke B Championship saw the Guelph Regals face-off with the Wallaceburg Griffins. The Griffins opened the scoring with a quick goal from Colton Fox but less than two minutes later, Guelph evened the score with a tally from Gryphon Turner. That would be all the scoring we would see in the first frame as the headed into the break tied 1-1. The Griffins took control of the game in the second as they scored four unanswered goals. The Regals made things interesting, scoring twice within the first three minutes of the third period, but Wallaceburg would stop the bleeding, holding on for a 7-4 victory. The contest saw Colton Fox, Gracin Yacks, and Toews Jacobs all finish with three point nights as The Griffins took home the Tyke B title.

The Kitchener Braves took on the Gloucester Griffins for the Tyke C Championship. Kitchener scored just 8 seconds into the game and went on to add another 3 goals in the first period, taking a 4-1 lead into the intermission. The Griffins would cut the deficit down to 2 in the second period as the trailed 6-4 heading into the final period. Despite two late goals from Gloucester, Kitchener would hang on to win the Tyke C Championship 8-6. Keaton Niereisei led the way for The Braves with a four-goal game, and Gavyn Lepage had an impressive hat trick in Gloucester's loss.

The D final was a battle between the Shelburne Vets and the Kahnawake Mohawks. Kahnawake jumped out to an early 2-0 lead, but Shelburne scored late in the first period to keep things close after the first. The teams swapped goals in the second frame, giving Kahnawake a 3-2 lead heading into the final period. The Mohawks would close the deal from there, adding three unanswered goals in the final period to cruise to a 6-2 win. Kahnawake had a full team effort with six different goal scores leading them to the Tyke D Championship.

The West Grey Rampage faced off with the Arthur 2 Aces in the E finals. The Aces came out flying, taking a 4-2 lead into the first intermission. West Grey didn't give

up there though, answering with three goals of their own in the second period to come back and take a 5-4 lead into the third. The Rampage were able to hold Arthur to one goal in the third, while adding two of their own to complete the comeback and win the Tyke E Championship by a score of 7-5. West Grey had six different goal scorers contribute to the Championship win.
