GOALTENDING RULES GIRLS FINALS

The Girls Peewee A Championship saw The Peterborough Lakers take on the Nepean Knights. Peterborough opened the scoring just eight seconds in but Nepean tied it up a minute later for an exciting start to the game. The Lakers would take control from there, scoring three unanswered goals for a 4-1 lead at the first intermission. Nepean would score the first two goals of the second period to cut the score to 4-3, but this would be as close as they'd get. Peterborough added five unanswered goals to win the Championship 9-3. Avery Mann led the way with a hat trick for The Lakers.

The Kitchener Braves faced off with the Kingston Crossfire for the Girls Peewee B Championship. Kitchener came out of the gates flying, scoring four straight goals in the first period. Kingston answered with two goals of their own in the second period to cut the lead to 4-2 heading into the final frame. Kitchener would repeat their first period success with four straight in the third to win 8-2. Breana Sanecki scored four goals and added three assists to lead The Braves to the Championship.

The Peterborough Lakers did battle with the Kitchener Braves for the Girls Bantam A Championship. Logan Fitzgerald scored the first three goals of the game for Peterborough as they took an early lead and didn't look back. Stella Burke also scored a natural hat trick and added a fourth goal late in the third as Peterborough defeated Kitchener 8-2 for the Championship.

The Girls Bantam B Championship was a matchup between the Wallaceburg Griffins and the Arthur Aces. Wallaceburg was able to score twice in the first period but it would be a defensive battle the rest of the way. Wallaceburg added a third goal in the second period, and neither team would be able to score in the third. Makenzee Peters was the star for The Griffins as her shutout led them to a 3-0 win.

The Girls Midget A Championship featured the Whitby Warriors and the Windsor Warlocks. Whitby came out flying, scoring less than a minute into the game and carried a 3-0 lead into the first intermission. Windsor would battle back and forth with them for the remainder of the game, but the early deficit was too much to overcome as The Warriors won 8-4.

The Simcoe Timberwolves faced off with the Mississauga Tomahawks in the Girls Midget B Championship. The first period was a defensive battle, with no goals being

scored until Carlie Ulmonen broke through with just two seconds left in the frame. That's all the support that Megan Carrier would need as she shut down Mississauga for the remainder of the game. Simcoe added a second period and two third period goals for a 4-0 Championship win.

The Girls Intermediate A Championship was a matchup between the Nepean Knights and the Kingston Crossfire. Kingston scored first and took a 1-0 lead into the second period. The Griffins scored just a minute and a half into the third to tie the game 3-3 but Brooklyn Rozario would win the game for The Tomahawks with less than two minutes to play as she won the Championship 4-3.

The Girls Intermediate C Championship saw the Strathroy Screaming Eagles do battle with the Brampton Excelsiors. Both teams defended well in the first period as the score remained 0-0 heading into the second. Strathroy exploded for three quick goals within a six-minute span to start the second period and take a 3-0 lead. This is all the scoring that the game would see as The Screaming Eagles would cruise on to a 3-0 Championship win.
