WALLACEBURG CAPTURES FIRST INTERMEDIATE "A" CHAMPIONSHIP SINCE 1993

The Wallaceburg Griffins edged the Cambridge Chiefs in the Intermediate "A" division to capture their first "A" division title since 1993. The teams were knotted up at one-aside under the final frame, where Colin Salisbury scored short-handed while teammate Storm Smith was serving a minor penalty. Wallaceburg managed to hold on to this 2-1 lead until the end of regulation to capture their third franchise "A" division title since Intermediate was first established in 1909; their only other championship win occurring in 1926.

On the 40th anniversary of their first Intermediate "B" title, the Six Nations Warriors 2 rolled over the West Durham Rockmen in a 6-2 final which saw the winning team capitalize on four power play goals. Tycie Cowan led the Warriors with two tallies while Ben Huffman and team captain Leon Henhawk each contributed a goal and an assist. Since capturing their first "B" title in 1978, Six Nations has won six "B" division championships including this year's banner.

The Guelph Regals shut down the Lincoln Crush 4-1 to earn their first ever franchise "C" division championship. Although both teams entered the third period tied at one, Matt Maldonado scored the go-ahead and then added two helpers on insurance goals by James Graff and Cam Saunders to push the Regals ahead of the Crush. Keegan Booth was steady in net for Guelph to secure the win.
