TEAM ONTARIO WINS JUNIOR WOMEN'S NATIONAL TITLE AFTER DOMINANT SHOWING AT FESTIVAL

Team Ontario took on Team Alberta in a battle for the 2014 Junior Women's National Championship title at the 2014 Ontario Lacrosse Festival.

Ontario went undefeated in regular play, defeating Alberta in both of their match-ups, 11-3 and 14-2.

Ontario proved to be Alberta's only weakness, as the team went undefeated with the exception of the two games they lost to the National Champions.

Ontario shut Alberta out until the third period in their final match-up, with Taryn Collins scoring for a 1-0 lead early in the first period.

Collins assisted two more goals in the second period, as Sassy Powless and Alexandra Ogilvie scored one each to put Ontario ahead 3-0.

Addie Hobbins tried to bring Alberta back into the mix with a third period goal, but Ontario's lead proved too great to diminish.

Taylor Milburn logged her first goal at the beginning of the final period, followed by goals from Ogilvie, Collins, Sarah Simpson, and Kathryn Simpson, to win the championship, 8-1.

British Columbia and Nova Scotia faced off for the Junior Women's bronze medal championship in a close 5-3 B.C. victory.

B.C. finished the round robin play with a 2-4 record, and Nova Scotia finished 0-6. B.C. also defeated Nova Scotia 5-0 and 5-3 in their previous regular play match-ups.

B.C. selected Meagan Stewart for the Junior All-Star Team, having placed fifth on the total points list, leading her team with seven goals and four assists.

Brooke Huber was chosen from Alberta after a great showing at the tournament, with six goals and three assists for a total of nine points.

Nova Scotia elected Allision Burke to the All-Star team, having logged three goals and two assists over the tournament to land her the 26th place spot on the total points list.

Placing third on the tournament total points list with 10 goals and four assists, Alexandra Ogilvie was chosen by Team Ontario for the All-Star Team selection.

Ontario's Emily Van Damme was also selected as the All-Star Goalie, contributing to her team's undefeated run at the Festival, with a tournament goals against average of 1.5.
