TYKE SEES TIGHT CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tyke A Championship featured the Northmen from Orangeville and the Lakers from Peterborough. Peterborough would jump out to an early 2-0 lead and wouldn't look back the rest of the game. Peterborough would outscore Orangeville in all three periods of play on-route to a convincing 9-2 victory. Ryder Evans and Joey Gusso would star for Peterborough, scoring a hat trick each in the Championship win.

The Kitchener-Waterloo Braves took on the Barrie Bombers in the Tyke B final. This final was tight from start to finish, with Barrie taking a 5-4 lead into the third period. Kitchener-Waterloo would score twice to take the lead, before Barrie tied the game up with just over 5 minutes to play. With just 2:34 to play, Oliver Warden completed his hat trick and scored the winning goal to lead Kitchener-Waterloo to a 7-6 Tyke B Championship.

The Tyke C Championship was a face-off between the Burlington 2 Chiefs and the Arthur Aces. The game was tied 3-3 after the first period, 5-5 after the second and 7-7 at the end of regulation time. Burlington exploded for 6 goals in the extra frame, resulting in a 13-7 final, but this game was a lot closer than the final score suggests. Colton Large scored four times to lead Burlington to the Tyke C title.

The Newmarket 2 Redbirds battled with the Windsor Warlocks in the intense Tyke D final. It was a full team effort from Newmarket, as each of their goals were scored by a different player. Lucas Sprogis second period goal would prove to be the game-winner, as Newmarket went on to win the final 5-3.

The Tyke E Final was another close contest, featuring the Whitby 3 Warriors and the Centre Wellington 2 Mohawks. Whitby would score the first two goals of the game, but Centre Wellington 2 would come right back to even the score at 2-2 to conclude the first period. The teams would also trade second period goals to enter the final frame tied 3-3. Both offence's picked it up in the third period as Madden Laporte's third goal of the game, with 4:27 remaining, would tie the game 6-6. Conner Beirnes would then score twice more, to complete his hat trick and lead Centre Wellington 2 to be Tyke E champs.
